

# ROADWAY CONSTRUCTION BEGINS ON TELEGRAPH ROAD

Drivers may notice more orange cones as they drive through the City with more roadway improvements continuing in the City. Beginning this month, the City, in collaboration with the City of Downey, will start work on a Roadway Improvement Project along Telegraph Road from the west City limit to Rosemead Boulevard and from Pasons Boulevard to the east City limit.

The project's overall plan for both Cities is to rehabilitate and beautify the corridor, streamline traffic flows, reduce conflicting vehicle movements, and enhance safety. The project will include the construction of a raised landscaped median, pavement reconstruction, ADA curb ramps, replacement of damaged sidewalks, curbs, and gutters. There will also be modifications to Telegraph Road and Birchbark Avenue's existing traffic signals, and at Telegraph Road and True Avenue.

"Our City's roads are heavily used since they are parallel to the 605 and 5 freeways," said City Manager Steve Carmona. "We are always looking for opportunities to rehabilitate our roads to keep them safe, and when we partner with other Cities such as the City of Downey, it creates



a partnership and assurance to residents on both sides that we are all committed to keeping our roadways as safe as possible for residents and for those that drive through our Cities on a daily basis."

The lead agency for the project is the City of Downey. The project is anticipated to be in construction through August 2021. Motorists are to expect delays and encouraged to take alternate routes during construction. ## FREE Senior Vaccination Transportation Offered

The City of Pico Rivera, in collaboration with Fiesta Taxi, is offering Pico Rivera residents age 65 years and older FREE transportation to the Los Angeles County COVID-19 Vaccination site in the City of Downey, and NOW extending to additional approved medical facilities that are offering the vaccine. You do not have to be registered for the Dial-A-Ride program.

With vaccines now available for residents who are 65 years of age and older, City Officials cited the importance of our senior residents to get vaccinated as soon as possible. With the City's Dial-A-Ride program already in place, the program allowed for seniors to make transportation for medical appointments within a six-mile radius of the City. City Officials decided to use the current service and create a dedicated program for seniors who wanted to received the COVID-19 vaccine, but had transportation issues.

"COVID-19 vaccinations are vital right now for those that are eligible and to those that will become eligible in the near future", said City Manager Steve Carmona. "This program will allow for our most vulnerable population to receive the COVID-19



vaccine in a timely manner without having to worry about transportation.

Eligible residents who have made an appointment at the Downey location or approved medical facility are able to book transportation at least 24 hours in advance by calling 866.908.7289 and using account number 12616. Each qualified resident will be offered only one free roundtrip for each vaccination trip. Please note, if medical facility is a walk-up location, the taxi will wait on site for you till your appointment is over.

# It's Time for Spring Cleaning and NASA Services Can Help

The City of Pico Rivera, in collaboration with NASA Services, will host a Spring Bulky Item Collection on five consecutive Saturdays, April 10 through May 8, based on your regular trash pick up days. (Please see schedule below)

This free, large-item curbside pick up is specifically for residential customers who need to dispose of large items that cannot be picked up as part of regular collection.

#### Eligible items for curbside bulk item pick up include:

- » Furniture such as chairs, sofas, and mattresses
- » Appliances such as refrigerators, ranges, washers, dryers, water heaters, dishwashers, and similar plumbing and small appliances
- » E-waste such as computers, telephones, televisions, stereo equipment, and other electronic devices. Yard waste such as tree branches, scrap wood, or bundles up to 4 ft. long
- » Clothing
- » Other non-hazardous items

#### \*All items must be able to be moved by two-person crews or they will NOT be collected\*

#### NOT acceptable items include:

- » All hazardous wastes or materials such as oil, solvents, or paints
- » Construction debris such as concrete, asphalt, lumber, or drywall
- » Equipment or vehicles
- » Truck or automobile tires

# \*All items must be placed at the curb no later than 6:00 a.m. on the scheduled day of collection\*
