

CITY EARNS DISTINGUISHED BUDGET PRESENTATION AWARD

The City of Pico Rivera is once again being recognized for its financial reporting with the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award from the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) for the City's the Fiscal Year 2023-2025 Biennial Budget document. This marks the fifth time the City has been recognized for their financial reporting.

The Distinguished Budget Presentation Award, which is the highest award in governmental budgeting, is presented to those government units whose budgets are judged to adhere to program standards. An independent panel of reviewers completed an examination of the budget document and the Budgetin-Brief document and voted to award the documents for the current fiscal period.

"The award represents a significant achievement by the entity. It reflects the commitment of the governing body and staff to meeting the highest principles of governmental budgeting. In order to receive the budget award, the entity had to satisfy nationally recognized guidelines for effective budget presentation," said a GFOA representative.

The award demonstrates the



City's commitment to transparency, fiscal responsibility, efficiency, and accountability while ensuring the budget is accessible to residents. This award is presented to recognize excellence in governmental budgeting and represents a significant

achievement for our team. The award also reflects the City's commitment to meeting the highest principles of governmental budgeting. It recognizes the hard work and dedication of the staff in preparing a budget that serves as a policy document, a financial plan, an operations guide, and a communication device.

"Government spending of any size is always under scrutiny and we take huge strides in assuring our residents that their tax money is being handled properly through transparent measures," said City Manager Steve Carmona. "This award proves that we are taking all the necessary steps in accurate financial reporting, and that we are taking the utmost care of our residents tax dollars."

Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department would like to warn the public of phone call scammers impersonating L.A. County Deputies using spoofing apps that shows the number on the victim's caller ID as the Sheriff's office or local police agencies.

Los Angeles County continues to receive reports from residents receiving phone calls from scammers claiming to be a Sheriff's Sergeant, Lieutenant or Office Personnel asking for payment for missing grand jury duty subpoena. The scammers will then ask for some type of electronic payment, and subsequently threaten the callers with their arrest if their

Construction Begins on Pro Shop

Last year, a late evening fire started in the storage area of the Pico Rivera Golf Club. The fire was contained to the storage area of the Golf Club's Pro Shop and Banquet facility. Luckily, no injuries were reported, and structural damage was minimal with smoke damage reported throughout the facility. Immediately following the fire, City crews worked to preserve the remaining structure to prevent further damage or vandalism.

Since then, the Pro Shop and the restaurant portion of the bar had to adjust daily operations while portions of the facility were closed due to the damage. While there was no damage to the banquet facility, the banquet facility was closed for approximately a month, and there was no phone communication for a while due to the extensive damage done to the phone equipment.

Fast forward to a year later, construction has been taking place at the Pro Shop and the facility may resume full operation later this Spring. Repairs to the damaged facility include removal



and reframing of damaged wooden posts, beams, sheathing, replacement of drywall, windows, doors, flooring and roofing; painting walls and ceilings, application of epoxy floor system; replacement of electrical panels, conduits, wires, HVAC unit and ducting. City officials anticipate repairs to be completed next month.

The Golf Club is open daily from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. The Driving Range is also open daily, with no club or driver restrictions.

SPRING CLEANING NASA Services is Here to Help

The City of Pico Rivera, in collaboration with NASA Services, will host a Spring Bulky Item Collection on five consecutive Saturdays, April 13 through May 11, **based on your regular trash pick-up days.** (Please see schedule below)

This free, large-item curbside pick-up is specifically for residential customers who need to dispose of large items that cannot be picked up as part of normal collection.

Eligible items for curbside bulky item pick-up include:

» Furniture such as chairs, sofas, and mattresses

» Appliances such as refrigerators, ranges, washers, dryers, water heaters, dishwashers, and similar plumbing and small appliances

» E-waste such as computers, telephones, televisions, stereo equipment, and other electronic devices; Yard waste such as tree branches, scrap wood, or bundles up to 4 ft. long

- » Clothing
- » Other non-hazardous items

All items must be able to be moved by two-man crews or they will NOT be collected.

NOT acceptable items include:

- » All hazardous wastes or materials such as oil, solvents or paints
- » Construction debris such as concrete, asphalt, lumber or drywall
- » Equipment or vehicles
- » Truck or automobile tires

***All items must be placed at the curb no later than 6:00 a.m. on the scheduled day of collection. ***

Please consider donating all reusable or repairable items to your local thrift stores and non-profit organizations as these items can help benefit those in need in our local community.


